Does Your Health Plan Cover Mental Health Services and Treatment?

Most health insurers in Pennsylvania provide some coverage for the treatment of mental health conditions. In addition, many health insurers that provide coverage of mental health conditions are required to provide coverage and administration of mental health treatment in ways that are comparable to other medical services.

Do You Need Coverage for a Mental Health Condition?

Call/contact your health insurer and ask the following questions. Please be sure to write down all responses:

- What coverage is available under my policy to treat mental health conditions?

Under most insurance policies that provide coverage for mental health conditions, your insurance company cannot impose less favorable benefit limitations on mental health benefits than on physical health benefits. It may be difficult to know if your health insurance company is following the law, so look for these red flags:

- Do you have a higher co-pay for mental health benefits versus physical health benefits?

- Do you have to ask your insurance company for permission (called prior authorization) to access mental health services, but that isn't required for physical health services?

These aren't the only warning signs for possible violations of the law, but these are red flags you can look for.
