**LIQUIDATOR'S FINAL ACCOUNTING AND
PETITION FOR DISTRIBUTION AND DISCHARGE**

Robert L. Pratter, Acting Insurance Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in his official capacity as Statutory Liquidator ("Liquidator") of American Integrity Insurance Company ("AIIC"), by his attorney, Preston M. Buckman, pursuant to 40 P.S. § 221.46 and 40 P.S. § 221.48, respectfully files this final accounting and petitions the Court to approve the distribution of AIIC's assets to its policyholders and discharge the Liquidator to complete the liquidation of AIIC, and thus represents:

1. By Order of this Court dated June 25, 1993, AIIC was ordered liquidated, and the Insurance Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania ("Commissioner") was appointed Liquidator and directed to take possession of AIIC's property and to liquidate its business and affairs. Robert L. Pratter is the current Commissioner, in an acting capacity, and thus is the current Liquidator of the AIIC estate.

2. An inventory of the assets of AIIC as of June 25, 1993 disclosed net assets of \$58,177,484.29. (See the Liquidator's final accounting for the AIIC estate, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A).

3. Changes in the net assets for the period from June 25, 1993 through June 30, 2010, indicate an increase of \$5,689,220.34 to \$63,866,704.63. The total net assets available for distribution as of June 30, 2010, after payment of administrative expenses incurred by the Liquidator are \$63,866,704.63. (See Exhibit A.)

4. All claims have been evaluated and there are no unresolved objections to the amount allowed for any claim.

5. The total for class "a", "b", "d", "e", "f", "g" and "i" priority claims that has been approved and allowed is \$99,561,752.48. There are no "c" or "h" claims.

6. Attached hereto as Exhibit "B" is a list of all AIIC claimants who had claims approved and the amount allowed for each claim. The Liquidator requests this Court's approval of the following distribution of the assets of AIIC as follows:

- a. Priority class "a" claims will be paid at 100%. The Liquidator has already received \$5,257,423.56 in administrative expenses.
- b. Priority class "b" claims will be paid at 62%.
- c. There are no priority class "c" claims.
- d. Priority class "d" claims will not be paid.
- e. Priority class "e" claims will not be paid.
- f. Priority class "f" claims will not be paid.
- g. Priority class "g" claims will not be paid.
- h. There are no priority class "h" claims.
- i. Priority class "i" claims will not be paid.

7. Attached hereto as Exhibit "C" is a copy of the Notice of the filing of this Final Accounting and Petition for Distribution and Discharge, to be sent to all claimants in this matter upon this Court's approval of the form of Notice.

8. All claimants listed on Exhibit "B" will be served with the Notice and provided 30 days from the date of the Notice to file objections, if any, to the Final Accounting and Petition for Distribution and Discharge.

9. Once all objections to the Final Accounting and Petition for Distribution and Discharge, if any, have been resolved, the Liquidator will file a final Motion with this Court seeking an order as set forth in Exhibit "D" approving his Final Accounting and Petition for Distribution and Discharge.


10. The Liquidator believes that no useful purpose will be served in preserving the records of AIIC, other than limited administrative files and records within the Liquidator's discretion, and therefore, recommends pursuant to Section 550 of the Insurance Department Act of 1921, Act of May 17, 1921, P.L. 789, No. 285, as amended, 40 P.S. §221.50, that the Liquidator be authorized to destroy records no longer considered useful.

11. The Liquidator believes that there are no other remaining assets of the company, but respectfully requests that in the event any unanticipated funds are received, such additional funds be used to satisfy any unreimbursed administrative expenses incurred by the Liquidator.

12. The Liquidator respectfully requests that Robert L. Pratter, in his official capacity as Acting Insurance Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and his predecessors and successors in office, be discharged as Statutory Liquidator of AIIC, and thereby released from any liability to make payment of any further claims following the distribution of AIIC's assets as proposed in this petition.

WHEREFORE, the Liquidator prays Your Honorable Court that the form of Notice to be sent by first-class mail to claimants be approved.


