Jessica K. Altman, Insurance Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania ("Commissioner"), in her official capacity as Statutory Liquidator for Legion Insurance Company ("Legion"), by and through her counsel, respectfully submits her Application for Approval of Administrative Expenses Paid for the Period January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018.

APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES PAID

1. Prior to receivership, Legion, Villanova Insurance Company ("Villanova") and Legion Indemnity Company ("Indemnity") operated with an expense sharing agreement, pursuant to which Legion paid the common expenses for all three companies through July 2003. Under the expense sharing agreement, common expenses were allocated 80% to Legion, 10% to Villanova and 10% to Indemnity. Following entry of the Court's Orders placing Legion and Villanova into liquidation in July 2003, the expenses were allocated 90% to Legion and 10% to

Villanova. The several schedules attached to this Petition represent the expenses paid by Legion and Villanova on a consolidated basis, including all common expenses, before any allocation.

- 2. Pursuant to the Court's Order of January 8, 2004, the Liquidator previously filed petitions for approval of administrative expenses paid beginning on July 29, 2003, which administrative expenses paid have been approved by the Court. Most recently, the petition for approval of administrative expenses paid for the period July 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017 was approved by the Court on April 5, 2018.
- 3. With the current Petition, the Liquidator respectfully petitions the Court for approval of her administrative expenses paid for the period January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018, as set forth on the attached Exhibit A, Combined Cash Basis Analysis, which were reasonable and necessary expenses for the administration of the Legion liquidation. In addition, Exhibit A shows adjustments identified in a reconciliation of administrative expenses for the period 8/1/03 through 6/30/18 conducted by the Chief Financial Officer and his staff.
- 4. The Affidavits of the Chief Liquidation Officer and the Vice President and Chief Financial Officer in support of the Liquidator's submission of the Petition for Approval of Administrative Expenses Paid, and the Certification of Department Counsel related to legal expenses paid are attached to this Petition.

WHEREFORE, the Liquidator requests that the Court enter the Order attached hereto approving the administrative expenses paid.

I, GERALD V. BEHR, hereby depose and state as follows:

- 1. I am Vice President and Chief Financial Officer for Legion Insurance Company (In Liquidation) and Villanova Insurance Company (In Liquidation) ("the Estates"), am currently licensed as Certified Public Accountant, and am responsible for overseeing all aspects of the Estates' financial operations.
- 2. I certify that the Application for Approval of Administrative Expenses paid for the period January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018 fairly presents in all material respects the Estates' paid administrative expenses for the period January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018 for the following areas of expenditure:
 - A. <u>Labor</u>: "Labor" includes expenses for salary and overtime compensation for all the Estates' employees, the performance compensation program, and a severance program for displaced employees of the Estates.

- B. <u>Benefits</u>: "Benefits" includes expenses for employee group health, life and disability programs, employee training, workers' compensation insurance, FICA and federal and state unemployment taxes.
- C. <u>Occupancy</u>: "Occupancy" includes expenditures for lease expenses in Philadelphia, utility and office maintenance expenses for leased premises, records retention, furniture repair and maintenance expenses and rental costs for postage and copier/fax equipment.
- D. <u>Equipment</u>: "Equipment" includes expenses for operating and applications systems software, and purchases and repairs of all other equipment used by the Estates.
- E. <u>Legal Fees and Expenses</u>: "Legal Fees and Expenses" includes expenditures to outside law firms for matters related to the Estates' defendant issues and liquidation issues.
- F. <u>Professional Services</u>: "Professional Services" includes expenditures for audit and tax consulting fees of independent CPA firms, and fees to outside firms for technology support and outsourcing.
- G. Other: "Other" includes expenditures for telephone, postage, express mail, printing and freight expenses, letterhead, envelopes and other office supplies; transportation, meals, lodging and other costs of employees while traveling; costs of the Pennsylvania Insurance Department for the oversight of the Estates; and insurance for fidelity and surety bonds on employees, general liability insurance, Directors and Officers and omissions coverage for directors

and personal property coverage.

- 3. In preparation for the closing of the Estate, my staff and I reviewed the administrative expenses of the Estate as reported to the Court from the inception of the Liquidation through 6/30/2018 in the semi-annual Applications for Approval of Administrative Expenses (the "Applications").
 - 4. Exhibit A reflects the results of that review.
- 5. In the section entitled "Adjustments Identified in Reconciliation of Period 8/1/03 through 6/30/18 the following adjustments are reflected.
 - A. The "TPA Fees" adjustment reflects TPA fees that were booked prior to 2008 in the Underwriting Expense category, but to be consistent with the accounting since 2008, are now reflected as administrative expense.
 - B. The "Labor" adjustment reflects a salary accrual that was incorrectly reported in 2005.
 - C. The "Other" adjustment reflects miscellaneous adjustments.
- 6. These adjustments as a result of the reconciliation are one-time adjustments so that the sums of all administrative expenses reported in the Applications will agree to the administrative expenses reported in the Quarterly Reports submitted to the Court.
- 7. Based on my knowledge, the Application for Approval of Administrative Expenses paid for the period January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018 fairly presents in all material respects the administrative expenses paid by the Estates for the period January 1, 2018 through June 30, 2018.
