CONSENT ORDER

AND NOW, this *28th* day of *July*, 2009, this Order is hereby issued by the Insurance Department of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania pursuant to the statutes cited above and in disposition of the matter captioned above.

1. Respondent hereby admits and acknowledges that he has received proper notice of his rights to a formal administrative hearing pursuant to the Administrative Agency Law, 2 Pa.C.S. § 101, et seq., or other applicable law.

2. Respondent hereby waives all rights to a formal administrative hearing in this matter, and agrees that this Consent Order, and the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein, shall have the full force and effect of an Order duly entered in accordance with the adjudicatory procedures set forth in the Administrative Agency Law, supra, or other applicable law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

3. The Insurance Department finds true and correct each of the following

Findings of Fact:

- (a) Respondent is Sean A. Hudson, and maintains his address at 1230 Valley View Blvd, Altoona, Pennsylvania 16602.

- (b) Respondent does not possess a producer license.

- (c) On or about March 8, 2000, Respondent was convicted of one (1) misdemeanor count of Possession of Stolen Goods/Property, and one (1) felony count of Possession of Stolen Goods/Property. Respondent was sentenced to time served.

- (d) On or about October 31, 2003, Respondent pled guilty to Simple Assault, Recklessly Endangering Another Person, Terroristic Threats, all misdemeanors, and to four (4) counts of Indirect Criminal Contempt of a Protection from Abuse Order. Respondent was sentenced to 2 ½ years probation, ordered to pay a \$1,350 fine and costs.

- (e) On or about September 2008, while purchasing a pistol and completing the required Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (ATF) form 4473, Respondent answered NO to the ATF application question, "Have you ever been convicted in any court of a felony, or any other crime, for which the judge could have imprisoned you for more than one year, even if you received a shorter sentence, including probation?"
- (f) Regarding the convictions noted in paragraphs 3(c) and 3(d), Respondent was required to answer the ATF form 4473 in the affirmative while purchasing a firearm.
- (g) April 24, 2009, Respondent electronically initiated an application for an initial resident producer's license, wherein he fully disclosed his criminal history.
- (h) On or about June 5, 2009, Respondent pled guilty to Unsworn Falsification to Authorities, in the Court of Common Pleas of Blair County, Pennsylvania. He was sentenced to six (6) months probation, and ordered to pay a \$100 fine, plus costs.
- (i) On July 13, 2009, Respondent agreed to licensure with 5 years of licensure supervision.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

4. In accord with the above Findings of Fact and applicable provisions of law, the Insurance Department concludes and finds the following Conclusions of Law:

- (a) Respondent is subject to the jurisdiction of the Pennsylvania Insurance Department.
- (b) 40 Purdon's Statutes, Section 310.6(a)(6), states that the Department shall issue a producer license, provided the applicant possesses the general fitness, competence and reliability sufficient to satisfy the Department that the applicant is worthy of a license.
- (c) Respondent's activities described above in paragraphs 3(c) through 3(f) violate 40 Purdon's Statutes, Section 310.6(a)(6).
- (d) 40 Purdon's Statutes, Section 310.11(14) prohibits a licensee or applicant from committing a felony or its equivalent.
- (e) Respondent's activities described above in paragraph 3(c) violates 40 Purdon's Statutes, Section 310.11(14).

(d) 40 Purdons Statutes, Section 310.11(7) prohibits a licensee or applicant from using fraudulent, coercive or dishonest practices or demonstrating incompetence, untrustworthiness or financial irresponsibility in the conduct of doing business.

(e) Respondent's activities described above in paragraphs 3(c) through 3(e) violate 40 Purdons Statutes, Section 310.11(7).

(f) 40 Purdons Statutes, Section 310.11(15) prohibits a licensee or applicant from committing a misdemeanor that involves the misuse or theft of money or property belonging to another person.

(g) Respondent's activities described above in paragraph 3(c) violates 40 Purdons Statutes, Section 310.11(15).

(h) Respondent's violations of Section 310.6(a)(6), 310.11(7), (14) and (15) are punishable by the following, under 40 Purdons Statutes, Section 310.91:

(i) suspension, revocation or refusal to issue the certificate of qualification or license;

- (ii) imposition of a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for every violation of the Act;
- (iii) an order to cease and desist; and
- (iv) any other conditions as the Commissioner deems appropriate.

ORDER

5. In accord with the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Insurance Department orders and Respondent consents to the following:

- (a) Respondent shall cease and desist from engaging in the activities described herein in the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.
- (b) Respondent's certificates and licenses may be immediately suspended by the Department following its investigation and determination that (i) any terms of this Order have not been complied with, or (ii) any complaint against Respondent is accurate and a statute or regulation has been violated. The Department's right to act under this section is limited to a period of five (5) years from the date of this Order.
- (c) Respondent specifically waives his right to prior notice of said suspension, but will be entitled to a hearing upon written request received by the Department no later than thirty (30) days after the date the Department

mailed to Respondent by certified mail, return receipt requested, notification of said suspension, which hearing shall be scheduled for a date within sixty (60) days of the Department's receipt of Respondent's written request.

(d) At the hearing referred to in paragraph 5(c) of this Order, Respondent shall have the burden of demonstrating that he is worthy of a license.

(e) In the event Respondent's certificates and licenses are suspended pursuant to paragraph 5(b) above, and Respondent either fails to request a hearing within thirty (30) days or at the hearing fails to demonstrate that he is worthy of a license, Respondent's suspended certificates and licenses shall be revoked.

6. In the event the Insurance Department finds that there has been a breach of any of the provisions of this Order, based upon the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein, the Department may pursue any and all legal remedies available, including but not limited to the following: The Department may enforce the provisions of this Order in an administrative action pursuant to the Administrative Agency Law, supra, or other relevant provision of law; or, if applicable, the Department may enforce the provisions of this Order in any other court of law or equity having jurisdiction.

7. Alternatively, in the event the Insurance Department finds that there has been a breach of any of the provisions of this Order, the Department may declare this Order to be null and void and, thereupon, reopen the entire matter for appropriate action pursuant to the Administrative Agency Law, supra, or other relevant provision of law.


8. In any such enforcement proceeding, Respondent may contest whether a breach of the provisions of this Order has occurred but may not contest the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law contained herein.


9. Respondent hereby expressly waives any relevant statute of limitations and application of the doctrine of laches for purposes of any enforcement of this Order.

10. This Order constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the matters referred to herein, and it may not be amended or modified except by an amended order signed by all the parties hereto.

11. This Order shall be final upon execution by the Insurance Department. Only the Insurance Commissioner or a duly authorized delegee is authorized to bind the Insurance Department with respect to the settlement of the alleged violations of law

contained herein, and this Consent Order is not effective until executed by the Insurance Commissioner or a duly authorized delegee.
