Dear Chief Brackbill:

I write to clarify my support for the Highmark-West Penn Allegheny Health System merger. While I stand by my support letter of February 22, 2012, I am concerned about new information that I hope will get proper scrutiny from the Pennsylvania Insurance Department. While I value competition among health systems and the jobs that it means for Westmoreland County residents, I want to be assured that the conditions are fair and that all facts are considered.

The Blackstone Advisory Partners and Compass Lexecon report posted on the Department's website contradicts testimony given at a Senate Majority Policy Committee public hearing in August 2012, where Highmark testified and promised that it would not harm Excela Health (one of Westmoreland County's largest employers) or not employ any of Excela's physicians. Yet the report stated its intention to move 41,135 admissions (page 145). This contradiction must be addressed as part of your final determination.

I remain in support of the merger, and continue to stay neutral in the ongoing dispute between Highmark and UPMC. But the Insurance Department must ensure that all questions, including the one I addressed above, are answered openly, honestly and completely.
